Timeouts, Halftime and Halftime Interviews

Team Called Timeouts: 60 seconds plus 25 seconds more for teams to get into ready position (1:25 total)

Time Between 1/2 and 3/4 Quarters: 90 seconds with an additional 25 seconds for the teams to get into ready position (1:55 total).

TV Timeouts: Two (2) 60 second timeouts with an additional 25 seconds for the teams to get into ready position (1:25 total) per quarter at the first dead ball after two full possessions (without killing momentum). SportsTime Ohio to provide sideline timeout coordinator.

Timeout Note: A timeout called by a team will count as a TV timeout if the timeout is not during the first drive of a quarter.

Halftime: Intermission shall be 20 minutes (25 minutes for state championship games) plus 3 minutes for teams to warm up. The field clock will start at 20 minutes (25 minutes for state championship games) upon the signal from the referee and the clock will run continuously to 0:00, at which time the clock will be reset to 3:00 and immediately started and run continuously to 0:00. Teams must return to the field within 20 minutes. Each band may perform for 10 minutes.

Coaches Halftime Interviews: SportsTime Ohio may conduct an interview with one coach as he is leaving the field for halftime. This shall be with the winning team's coach, or the home team's coach if the score is tied. The other coach will be interviewed when he comes onto the field to begin second-half warm-ups.
