End of Week Two!

Most schools have begun to participate in scrimmages and are awaiting the opening for regular season contests on August 17. We wish you the best as you compete this year and hope the experience will be educational for the students who are participating in your 7-8th grade and high school programs. Please remember to check with your athletic administrator and/or principal to insure that you have <u>received eligibility clearance</u> for each student who is on your school team. In addition, your athletic administrator will verify that all students have been cleared by a medical examiner as required yearly and certified on a pre-participation evaluation.

Uniform Questions

The focus of the last part of this year's rules interpretation meeting for coaches was a review of the uniform regulations which will become effective in 2016. We continue to receive requests for guidance on this issue as schools do not want to make expensive mistakes. Also, many schools will wish to keep uniforms purchased in 2013 in service for at least three years. We welcome your questions and ask that you provide us with a picture of the uniform under consideration along with your questions. Concussion Legislation Reminders

This past April, Gov. Kasich signed HB 143 into law. This law mirrors regulations that the OHSAA has had for the last several years with just a few exceptions. During the 2012 season, officials removed 17 volleyball players from competition for exhibiting signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with concussion. Although our sport is considered rather "low risk" for these injuries, coaches and officials must be constantly vigilant in protecting students from further injury.

Coaches, please encourage your students and their parents to view one of the free online concussion courses sponsored by NFHS or the CDC, and even though you are required to complete a concussion course when you renew your Pupil Activity Permit, why wait? Take it now. Officials, please be certain that you are aware of your responsibility to file the Concussion Report Form in the event that a player is removed from a contest under your supervision.

Terrible Towels?

The <u>deleted</u> rules reference to a towel tucked into a uniform waistband has caused some consternation. The rule now reads, "Any equipment that in the judgment of the first referee increases a player's advantage or presents a safety concern is prohibited." Here are some of the Q's and A's about this rules change.

- 1. If the towel hits the net, is this a net fault? YES.
- 2. Do towels need to be a certain color based on the color of the uniform? NO restriction on color. They are Not part of the player's uniform.
- 3. Is there a size requirement? NO for the same reason listed above . .
- 4. Is there a limit to the number of players who can wear them? NO. With nothing specific from the NFHS, there is no reason to rule otherwise.
- 5. Is there a certain place they have to tucked? NO. They can be on the front as shown in the slide. They can also be at the side or in the in the back. The key issue is they should be secured so they do not fall onto the floor.
- 6. Can one player wear two towels? NO.
