Timeouts, Halftime and Halftime Interviews

Team Called Timeouts: 60 seconds plus 25 seconds more for teams to get into ready position (1:25 total)

Time Between 1/2 and 3/4 Quarters: 90 seconds with an additional 25 seconds for the teams to get into ready position (1:55 total).

TV Timeouts: Either one (1) :90 timeout or two (2) :60 second timeouts plus an additional 25 seconds for the teams to get into ready position (1:25 total) **per quarter** at the first dead ball after two full possessions (without stopping momentum). STO/TWC will determine per game and provide sideline timeout coordinator.

Timeout Note: A timeout called by a team will count as a TV timeout if the timeout is not during the first drive of a quarter.

Halftime: Intermission shall be the normal 20:00 plus 3:00 for teams to warm up. The field clock will start at 20:00 upon the referee's signal and the clock will run continuously to 0:00, at which time the clock will be reset to 3:00 and immediately started and run continuously to 0:00. Teams must return to the field within 20 minutes. Each band may perform for 10 minutes.

Coaches Halftime Interviews: STO/TWC may conduct an interview with coaches leaving the field for halftime. Typically, the winning team's coach will be interviewed when leaving the field for halftime (or the home team's coach if the score is tied). The other coach will be interviewed when he returns to the field.
