Hair Control Devices

Question - Does a hair ribbon need to be tied on or can it be clipped on? Answer - The Ribbon needs to be soft & no wider than 2 inches. It needs to be tied on.

Here are the rules references regarding hair devices:

4-1-ART. 5 . . . Hair devices made of soft material and no more than 2 inches wide may be worn. Bobby pins, <u>flat clips</u> and flat barrettes, <u>unadorned</u> and no longer than 2 inches, are also allowed.

4.1.5 SITUATION: A player enters the game wearing: (a) hair tied back with a 2-inch wide ribbon; (b) decorated barrette covered with tape; (c) hair tied back with a bandanna folded so it is only 2 inches wide; (d) a bandanna covering the entire head; (e) unadorned bobby pins or flat metal clips no longer than 2 inches. RULING: (a), (c) and (e) legal; (b) and (d) illegal equipment. COMMENT: Unnecessary delay assessed and the illegal items must be removed.

From last year's Case Book New Situations:

SITUATION: During warm-ups, a referee notices a player wearing (a) reflective, sequins headband 1½ inches wide; (b) metal charms on shoelaces; (c) tape around one wrist or at the top of one ear. RULING: (a) and (c) legal; (b) illegal. COMMENT: A headband must be made of soft material. The reflective material or sequins should not be hard, unyielding or easily removed. <u>As with any legal hair device or adornment, if the item falls out or delays play in any</u> way, it shall be removed or the player(s) must be replaced. Metal charms are considered jewelry and must be removed before a player can enter the set. Unless it is obvious there

is jewelry present, referees need not look under tape to see if there is jewelry as the head coach has verified the player's legality in reference to the equipment and uniform rule. (Rule 4-1-5, 6)

Accommodations for Students with Special Needs

NOTE 2 PRIOR TO NFHS VB RULE 4 – PLAYER EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORM permits the OHSAA to authorize exceptions to playing rules which provide reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities or special needs or who may have unique circumstances provided such accommodations do not fundamentally alter the competition or endanger anyone. Thus, we have issued letters of approval for players to wear various medical devices such as <u>insulin</u> <u>pumps, heart monitors and cochlear implants</u> as well as head coverings for both religious and medical reasons. We expect that school personnel, either the head coach or an administrator, to secure this letter of authorization for any student who might require special accommodations. This letter from the OHSAA shall be made available to the first referee at or prior to the pre-match conference, in the event that a medical, religious or other special need requires the modification of player accessories/equipment or uniform. If you have not taken care of this request, please do so immediately so that the student may enjoy participation in interscholastic volleyball if otherwise qualified. REMINDER: 4-1-1 prohibits the wearing of any type of guard, cast or brace, even though it might be of soft, pliable plastic, on the hand, finger, wrist or forearm.
