Season Opens On August 1!

Just as with the 2014 volleyball season, each year for the foreseeable future, coaching and instruction may begin on August 1. The exception to this rule is when August 1 falls on Sunday. In those years, the season will begin on August 2.

Last Chance to Review New Uniform Rules Before the 2016 Effective Date

We continue to receive many questions about the new uniform rules which become effective at the start of the 2016 season. If you are considering purchasing new uniforms in 2015, please be sure that the uniforms are compliant if you plan to use them for more than one season. We have been reviewing these rules for the last three years, and this bulletin will again review those rules. We will also cover these again in the online rules meeting and include them in your volleyball manual.

Beginning in July 2016, WHICH MEANS NEXT YEAR IN THE 2016 SEASON, the libero shall wear a uniform top that is immediately recognized from all angles as being in clear contrast to and distinct from the other members of the team. The libero and/or his/her teammates shall wear a solid-colored uniform top. Regarding the solid-colored top:

- The solid color uniform top shall clearly contrast from the predominant color(s) of the teammates' uniform top. Predominant color(s) is the color(s) appearing on approximately half of the uniform.
- Sleeves shall be the same color as the body of the uniform top.
- Piping/trim not exceeding one inch (1") in total at its widest point may be placed along the seams and maybe a different color(s) than the uniform top.
- Lettering and colors may be a different color(s) than the uniform top.
- A single school name, mascot and/or player's name may be placed on the body of the uniform top, but shall not disrupt the integrity of the solid-colored uniform top.
 Designs are not permitted. A single mascot reference and/or school name may be placed on the sleeve(s), not to exceed 4 by 4 inches or 3 by 5 inches.
- Numbers shall be a contrasting color to the uniform top and meet all other specifications in Rule 4-2-4.
