## Season Opens For Mandatory Training/Practice On August 1!

The season has arrived. Please be sure that all players who report for your squads have been cleared to play by your administrator, which means that they are eligible to participate for your school AND have been cleared to play by a physician or other medical examiner. Note the important items in the right margin of this newsletter – YOUR MANDATORY ONLINE RULES MEETING AND YOUR PUPIL ACTIVITY PROGRAM/COACHING PERMIT.

Unfortunately, we experienced a publishing glitch on both the coaches and officials meetings. We took down those links on July 29 and they are now active again. The coaches meeting was missing audio from slides 50-74 and the officials meeting was mislabeled as "football." #### <u>New Uniform Rules Become Effective for the 2016 High SchoolVolleyball</u> <u>Season</u>

We continue to receive many questions about the new uniform rules which become effective at the start of the 2016 season. If you are considering purchasing new uniforms this year in 2015, please be sure that the uniforms are compliant if you plan to use them for more than one season. We have been reviewing these rules for the last three years, and this bulletin will again review those rules. We will also cover these again in the online rules meeting and include them in your volleyball manual.

# Beginning in July 2016, WHICH MEANS NEXT YEAR IN THE 2016 SEASON, the libero shall wear a uniform top that is immediately recognized from all angles as being in clear contrast to and distinct from the other members of the team. The libero and/or his/her teammates shall wear a solid-colored uniform top. Regarding the solid-colored top:

- The solid color uniform top shall clearly contrast from the predominant color(s) of the teammates' uniform top. Predominant color(s) is the color(s) appearing on approximately half of the uniform.
- Sleeves shall be the same color as the body of the uniform top.
- Piping/trim not exceeding one inch (1") in total at its widest point may be placed along the seams and maybe a different color(s) than the uniform top.
- Lettering and colors may be a different color(s) than the uniform top.
- A single school name, mascot and/or player's name may be placed on the body of the uniform top, but shall not disrupt the integrity of the solid-colored uniform top. Designs are not permitted. A single mascot reference and/or school name may be placed on the sleeve(s), not to exceed 4 by 4 inches or 3 by 5 inches.
- Numbers shall be a contrasting color to the uniform top and meet all other specifications in Rule 4-2-4.
