### VOLLEYBALL IS VOLLEYBALL

We continue to receive questions about whether students who have become members of their school teams are eligible to participate with a non-school team during the season. The answer to that question is "no," and the reference is found in Sports Regulation 7, Non-School Programs or Teams. Sand or beach volleyball has become very popular in Ohio. However, there is no exemption to this regulation for volleyball played on that surface. Once a student has become a member of her volleyball team by participating in a contest, she must cease any non-school volleyball regardless of the surface on which it is played, where it is played or whether it is competition, tryouts (including a colleges or universities) training, practice, etc. until after she has played in her last match for the school. The reason for these rules is to maintain a level playing "field," preserve the integrity of school programs, and, interestingly, look out for the safety of all players.

# OFFICIALS AND COACHES

### **OFFICIAL VOLLEYBALL**

The OHSAA has adopted the Molten IV58L-BKSV-OH Super Touch white, silver and black premium volleyball as the "Official Ball of the OHSAA." This ball shall be used in all <u>OHSAA volleyball tournament</u> <u>competition</u> for the 2015 season. Schools may continue to use an all white ball for regular season contests as per NFHS rules or may choose to use another Molten colored volleyball for the regular season.

# **REGULAR SEASON BEGINS ON AUGUST 22**

Volleyball schools may begin regular season competition on Saturday, August 22. Please take a moment to review your schedule to ensure that there are no more than 22 regular season matches contracted for your varsity and non-varsity squads. Seventh and eighth grade squads may play 20 matches on no more than 16 playing dates plus one post-season (after the regular season 20 matches) tournament not to exceed four matches. Please remember that the consequence for exceeding the match limitation is severe – denial of OHSAA tournament participation for the high school which is in violation.
